BOY SCOUT JAMBOREE UPDATE:

A letter has been mailed to all EMS agencies in our Council region announcing the upcoming Jamboree and seeking EMS coverage sign-up. We will need 5 ambulances during the daytime and 2 at night. We also would like 14 ambulances for the arena show nights. Carolyn Marsh our Field Coordinator is handling the agency sign-up.

Have completed the changes to the Jamboree SOGs as discussed by Committee and forwarded a draft to Chief Glembot at Fort A.P. Hill for his input. Also sent a copy to Jamie Shaw our BSA contact. Still working on including a "definitions section" to the final SOG as suggested. We received twenty 2005 National Scout Jamboree Binder Notebooks from the BSA which will be used to house our SOG document, maps, MCI Plan, and other important documents our participating agencies will need.
