About the Service

The purpose of the National EMS Memorial Service is to honor and remember those emergency medical services personnel who have lost their lives in the line of duty and to recognize the ultimate sacrifice they have made for their fellow human beings.

During the service a family member or agency representative will be presented with a United States flag that has been flown over the U.S. Capitol denoting the honoree's service to their country, a white rose representing their undying love, and a medallion signifying their eternal memory.

As part of the service, each person being recognized tonight is also represented by their state flag. After the last name has been read there will be a National Moment of Silence, followed by an air-medical flyover and the playing of taps.

The names of those who are honored here appear on the "Tree of Life," the National EMS Memorial.

Paramedic Raymond "Ray" Bernard Allison

Sterling County EMS Sterling City, Texas

Last Call: February 11, 2014

On Tuesday, February 11, 2014, Ray was attending a patient who was being transported to Shannon Medical Center in San Angelo. While en route, the ambulance was involved in a motor vehicle crash and Ray, the patient and the patient's brother, who was riding in the ambulance, all sustained fatal injuries.

Flight Nurse James "Jamie" J. Butler

TriState CareFlight Santa Fe, New Mexico Last Call: July 17, 2014

On Thursday, July 17, 2014, the helicopter that Jamie and two other crew members – David Cavigneaux and Rebecca Serkey – were riding crashed in rugged, isolated terrain. The helicopter was flying from Christus St.Vincent Regional Medical Center in Santa Fe to Tucumcari to pick up a patient when it disappeared from radar at 2:48 a. m. All three crew members died in the crash.

Last Call: August 27, 2014

Monica and the other crew members – Juan Alfredo "Freddy" Martinez, and Taurean Summers – were all killed in the crash, including the patient who was being transported.

Paramedic Benjamin J. Finney

Sedgwick County EMS

Wichita, Kansas

Last Call: October 17, 2004

On October 17, 2004, Lt. J. Finney worked an extended shift and responded to multiple calls including a child not breathing. He and his partner were also threatened and assaulted on another call in the shift. Within several hours of the end of that shift, J. went to the middle school where he was head coach for their football team, and began readying for practice. At 3:10 p.m. he was found unresponsive. CPR was initiated, but efforts to resuscitate him were unsuccessful.

Paramedic Gerald "Garry" Hammer

Parkview-LaGrange County EMS

LaGrange, Indiana

Last Call: January 31, 2014

On January 31, 2014, Garry had worked a 12-hour rotation. During his shift he responded to multiple calls including at least two extended inter-facility transfers. Both of these transfers were emergency status and both involved a long distance, taking approximately three hours each to turn around. The last transfer ended shortly before the end of his shift. Garry went home from work and collapsed within ten minutes. He was not able to be resuscitated.



EMT Micheal "Mike" Charles Howard

Jewett EMS, Inc. Jewett. Texas

Last Call: September 13, 2014

On September 13, 2014, at approximately 6:00 a.m., Mike and his partner, Don Chandler, responded to a 911 call in the Flynn area. At the residence, they entered the home with the stretcher and began to evaluate the patient who had called. It was during this time that Mike collapsed with a cardiac event and could not be resuscitated.

EMS Pilot Juan Alfredo "Freddy" Martinez

Elite Medical Transport El Paso, Texas

Last Call: August 27, 2014

On Wednesday, August 27, 2014, Freddy was the EMS pilot on a fixed wing air ambulance that was transporting a patient when the Cessna plane crashed. Freddy and the other crew members – Monica Chavez and Taurean Summers – were all killed in the crash, including the patient who was being transported.

Paramedic Dennis Houston Rushing

ASAP Ambulance Service Laurel, Mississippi Last Call: June 24, 2014

Dennis' strong religious convictions and deep value for human life meant that he would do everything permissible to take care of people who needed him, and he did so until his final moments. On June 24, 2014, Paramedic Dennis Rushing, 31, and EMT Alan Smith, 48, were responding to a medical call on Mississippi Highway 63. As they passed two 18-wheelers, the lead truck made a left turn into the path of the ambulance killing Dennis and Alan.



Flight Paramedic Rebecca Serkey

TriState CareFlight Santa Fe, New Mexico Last Call: July 17, 2014

On Thursday, July 17, 2014, the helicopter that Rebecca and two other crew members – Jamie Butler and David Cavigneaux – were riding crashed in rugged, isolated terrain. The helicopter was flying from Christus St. Vincent Regional Medical Center in Santa Fe to Tucumcari to pick up a patient when it disappeared from radar at 2:48 a. m. All three crew members died in the crash.

EMT William "Alan" Smith

ASAP Ambulance Service Laurel, Mississippi Last Call: June 24, 2014

Alan was not just an EMT. He truly loved what he did and, in the end, he gave his all. On June 24, 2014, EMT Alan Smith, 48, and his partner Paramedic Dennis Rushing, 31 were responding to a medical call on Mississippi Highway 63. As they passed two 18-wheelers, the lead truck made a left turn into the path of the ambulance killing Alan and Dennis.

Flight Nurse Leslie Stewart

Air Evac Lifeteam Duncan, Oklahoma

Last Call: October 8, 2014

In the early morning hours of Saturday, October 4, 2014, the Air Evac Lifeteam helicopter was transporting a patient from Waurika, Oklahoma to Wichita Falls, TX for treatment. Shortly before they arrived at the receiving hospital, the helicopter crashed, killing the patient and injuring Leslie, and her paramedic partner Erasmus "Johan" van der Colff. Leslie died of her injuries four days later on October 8, 2014.



Paramedic Taurean Summers

Elite Medical Transport El Paso, Texas

Last Call: August 27, 2014

On Wednesday, August 27, 2014, Taurean was the paramedic on a fixed wing air ambulance that was transporting a patient when the Cessna plane crashed. Taurean and the other crew members – Monica Chavez and Juan Alfredo "Freddy" Martinez – were all killed in the crash, including the patient who was being transported.

Flight Paramedic Erasmus "Johan" van der Colff

Air Evac Lifeteam Duncan, Oklahoma

Last Call: October 22, 2014

In the early morning hours of Saturday, October 4, 2014, the Air Evac Lifeteam helicopter was transporting a patient from Waurika, Oklahoma to Wichita Falls, TX for treatment. Shortly before they arrived at the receiving hospital, the helicopter crashed, killing the patient and injuring Johan and his flight nurse partner Leslie Stewart. Johan died of his injuries 18 days later on October 22, 2014.

EMT William "Will" Russell Wiita

Coldsprings-Excelsior Fire and Rescue Kalkaska, Michigan Last Call: September 8, 2014

Will was one of the few people in the world who helped everyone, never complained, and brought laughter and joy to many of the families at Station 6. He is remembered for his unending dedication to the people of his community. Approximately three hours after responding to a rescue/medical call on September 8, 2014, Will was found deceased at his residence from an apparent heart attack.
