Old Business	<p>Regional Medication Shortages: Committee reviewed current regional medication shortages as presented by pharmacies present:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Regional Pharmacies will be phasing Diltiazem, Dopamine and Sodium Bicarb back into the med boxes and Acudose as now available. - Ketamine: Only a small quantity still available for regional pharmacies. Following lengthy discussion, motion made by Lori Knowles, seconded by Lori Feldman and carried to provide Ketamine for region’s EMS Supervisor vehicles to ensure up to two available for: Caroline (1), Fredericksburg (1), King George (2), Spotsylvania (2), and Stafford (2) with a total of 8 issued. Will be placed in separate Narcotic Kit bag with identifying sticker for “EMS Supervisor Use Only” and must be exchanged directly in hospital pharmacies. EMS agencies must understand if during exchange, no Ketamine is available, the special issued kit will not be exchanged. Versed remains a secondary option for EMS units as already in Narcotic Kits. <p>Christina Rauch will prepare a list of approved EMS Supervisor names and vehicle numbers and send to participating pharmacies. Once distributed, the pharmacies will coordinate the initial distribution, with 4 kits each from MWHC and SRMC.</p> <p>EMS Agency CSRs Update: EMS Agency Controlled Substance Registrations were renewed in February 2019. REMS has been working with area Pharmacies to ensure they have copies of all CSRs on file as regulated. Still need copies from Caroline, Fauquier, King George, LOW and Westmoreland. Chairman Joey King will personally reach out</p>	<p>REMS update Regional Medication Shortage list for EMS notification.</p> <p>Christina Rauch to provide list to Pharmacies on EMS Supervisor Vehicle #s and names. Pharmacies to then coordinate distribution of 8 Ketamine Kits in field.</p> <p>Joey King to contact agencies who have not submitted CSR.</p>

New Business	<p>Color Coded Syringes for EPI: Jennifer Lynch of Sovereign Medical was present to provide information and a demo on their new products available for accurate dosing with color codes and syringe sleeves that can also be used by BLS per new regulations.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Epinephrine Convenience Kit for Anaphylaxis in pediatric patients age 0 – 8 years \$89 per kit; up to 2 years shelf life; contains Epinephrine 1mg/ml Vial and color-coded syringe sleeve MWHC is currently looking to add this product in the Emergency Departments and is going to P&T Review this week for approval. - PALS Syringe Holder Kit for pediatrics \$75 each and comes in a case of 4 at \$300. Includes syringe sleeves for Epi, Lidocaine and Atropine as well as retractable length-based resuscitation tape - Spotsylvania County Fire & Rescue looking at products in last EMS Workgroup meeting and recommend for REMS BLS Stat Kits - Will need to address how EMS agencies will store since product will increase size of current Regional STAT Kit <p>Pharmacy Committee recommends hospitals purchase the Epinephrine Convenience Kits and place in Regional STAT Kit. Need to do more research on vendors the hospitals can purchase from, storage, and data from past year to support need and use for pediatric anaphylaxis. Will place on next committee agenda for further discussion.</p> <p>Regional Drug Box Agency Site Visits: MWHC conducted a site visit at Fort A. P. Hill last month to review their regional medication exchange process and policies. Several recommendations were made which were shared with REMS and the Pharmacy Committee Chair. Lori Feldman would like to conduct more regular site visits of agencies who are maintaining the Pharmacy issued drug boxes. Was a great opportunity to engage EMS and continue to build a strong program.</p> <p>Regional Restocking Agreement: MWHC shared that their REMS Regional Restocking Agreement will expire in September 2019 with consecutive automatic annual renewals following. The REMS Board of Directors reviewed the Restocking Agreement at their April 2019 meeting with no changes. Upon committee review, only see updates needed to sub-exhibits of agreement (current medication list, etc.)</p>	<p>Place item on October 2019 Pharmacy Committee Agenda for further discussion and review follow ups.</p>

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	<p>Wayne Perry shared a question had been asked as to whether an agency can participate in the REMS Regional Restocking Agreement if their OMD is not from within the REMS region. The committee agreed that any agency can enter into contract with REMS for restocking as long as they had a state certified OMD.</p> <p>MWHC EMS Med Acudose: Lori Feldman shared that she is working with Regulatory and the manufacturer of our EMS Med Acudose machines to attempt to extend the password reset to six months versus 90 days.</p> <p>REMS Protocol Update Recommendations: Wayne Perry shared the Regional Protocol Committee is looking at some new protocols that would need support from the hospital pharmacies. They would like to add the following drugs to the current medication list and if available and provided by pharmacies, will develop new protocols:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - PO Tylenol for pediatrics: Pharmacies present advised they could provide unit dose cups which will fit in current med boxes - Nitro Paste: Pharmacies present advised they could order and provide in packets which are less expensive than tubes. - Glucagon for EMT-Basic level also being considered as protocol update and already provided in med boxes. Would need to add/move to Regional Stat Kit if approved. Pharmacies expressed concern that this is an expensive drug (\$200 per kit) and recommended that the current drug be moved from med box to STAT kit to save on expenses. Would need to address how this would affect those agencies not currently using a Regional Stat Kit. - Wayne will share the Pharmacy Committee's input with the Protocol Committee as they further discuss. No changes to be made by Pharmacies until Regional Protocol approved and announced.

Approval of Minutes	Minutes of July 11, 2019 were previously provided to committee members for review. - Motion by Christina Rauch, seconded by Lori Feldman and carried to approve.	
Old Business	<p>Regional Medication Shortages: Committee reviewed current regional medication shortages as presented by pharmacies present:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - MWHC has added back to their shortage list the following drugs as still limited supplies and unavailable: Diltiazem and Dopamine Pre-Mix 250ml bags. SRMC advised they can still stock these medications as available. - MWHC is seeing an increase in shortage of abboject/bristoject medications and the pharmacy will be providing as a kit in the regional drug box or Acudose whenever needed. This includes Sodium Bicarb, Epi 1:10,000, and Lidocaine. The EMS Med Kits remain a priority and will be stocked with pre-filled syringes whenever possible. <p>Ketamine Kits: The 8 Regional Ketamine Kits were distributed to the localities by MWHC and SRMC. A list of approved EMS Supervisor names and vehicle numbers was provided to the participating pharmacies. These kits must be exchanged directly in the Pharmacy. Program is working well during the Ketamine shortage. SRMC advised they can now purchase Ketamine and MWHC indicated they would check with their buyer. Anticipate phasing back in. Will keep Ketamine Kits in use until fully implemented.</p> <p>Color Coded Syringes for EPI: Jennifer Lynch of Sovereign Medical was present at the last meeting to provide information and a demo on their new products available for accurate dosing with color codes and syringe sleeves that can also be used by BLS per new regulations. Polled EMS agencies to determine how often Pediatric Epi is given for anaphylaxis: Only Stafford Fire & Rescue reported with 5 cases of allergic reaction with Epi administered since 4/2018. SRMC advised their Corporate Division is against the product as too expensive (\$89 per kit) to support through hospital pharmacy with over 300 EMS Med Boxes in field in REMS. MWHC is already ordering for the EDs but in a very limited supply.</p>	Hospital Pharmacies to confirm availability of Ketamine and develop plan to phase back in to drug box.

	<p>Motion made by Mike Neace, seconded by Lori Feldman and carried to table as committee continues to look at other approved alternatives for consideration in REMS Stat Kits that are more cost effective. OEMS has reviewed options for dose limiting syringes and reportedly there are only two on the market right now. One to consider is the Epirite Syringe (\$17 for a box of 100) which could be made as an Epi Kit that is also placed in the current medication box. Once options reviewed by Committee, will need to move to Protocol and Medical Direction Committees. Bring more information to next meeting.</p> <p>DEA and Other Legislative Changes Update: Still working on rule writing phase. REMS was advised of a drug diversion case in another council region that was being reviewed closely by the DEA and Board of Pharmacy. The affected Pharmacy was told they were no longer in compliance and could not provide Narcotic Kits to EMS agencies. Need to keep a close eye on this investigation and outcomes as most likely will affect other regions. Recommended looking at tracking of Narcotic Kits, exchange trends, random waste audits and how Schedule VI drugs are handled and tracked. Joey King will set up a work group from the Committee to begin looking at for REMS region as legislative changes coming regarding hospitals no longer being permitted to issue EMS drug boxes. Will look at other state models and healthcare systems as a starting point.</p> <p>REMS Protocol Update Recommendations: The Protocol, OMD and Guidelines and Training Committees have continued their work or updates to the protocols. Several changes were discussed at our last meeting:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - PO Tylenol for pediatrics: Pharmacies present advised they could provide unit dose cups which will fit in current med boxes. Upon review by other committees it was determined this will not work for febrile seizure patients. Need to look at options for rectal administration. - Nitro Paste: Pharmacies present advised they could order and provide in packets which are less expensive than tubes. - GTC preferred Epi Certadose versus moving Glucagon into STAT Kits as discussed in last meeting. Still under review. - Protocol Committee would like consideration for more concentrated volume of Versed (want 5mg/1ml) in order to give IN and IM. Will discuss at next meeting. 	<p>Bring more information on Epirite Syringe to next meeting.</p> <p>Chairman to set up work group to begin review and planning for upcoming legislative changes on EMS med kits.</p> <p>Pharmacies look at options for Versed 5mg/1ml and discuss at next meeting.</p>
New Business	<p>Medication Waste Policy: MWHC shared information on how they currently handle medication wastes to ensure in compliance with regulations. A recent announcement was shared by other Council Regions regarding medication waste alerts for biohazardous meds. This new EPA Hazardous Waste Pharmaceuticals Rule that went into effect February 2019 did not affect the REMS region as we do not carry any of the drugs that would fall in that category. Reportedly some EMS agencies have their own waste policies and use ambulance partners to waste drugs before exchanging. This has some concerns by the hospital staff. In these cases, both EMS providers should sign the Regional EMS Med</p>	<p>Recommend adding Medication Waste guidance and procedures to REMS Medication & Accountability SOG</p>

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	<p>Exchange Form under the waste section as the official Pharmacy record. Committee recommended looking at adding some guidance on medication wastes to the REMS Regional Medication Accountability SOG.</p> <p>BP Management Med in Regional Drug Box for Hospital tPA Transfers: Mary Washington Hospital has been working with REMS and LifeCare to develop a process and policy for ground transport of tPA patients who need interfacility transfer for endovascular treatment of LVO. Currently use Air Medical but due to weather and other circumstances not always available. Do not want to delay giving tPA if ground transport and this is covered in the REMS Stroke Plan. Education with LifeCare has been completed and Agency Protocol signed off by Agency OMD and MWHC. Will be looking to place Vasotec in the Regional Drug Box to support blood pressure management of patient with tPA infusing as part of that policy. If approved by the REMS Board in October (under Exhibit A.2 of Regional Restocking Agreement Med List), LifeCare will be the only agency trained and permitted to give this drug. Wayne Perry and Dr. White, RMD, will be bringing to the REMS Protocol Committee for consideration of a future blood pressure management regional protocol. SRMC advised they would be able to restock the Vasotec when approved and placed in REMS med boxes.</p> <p>REMS announced a CBRN class to be held in Stafford on December 7 & 8, 2019.</p>

Old Business	<p>Regional Medication Shortages: Committee reviewed current regional medication shortages as presented by pharmacies present:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - No new medication shortages reported by hospital pharmacies. All continue to see shortages of abboject/brisoject medications and the pharmacies are providing as kits in the regional drug box to include Sodium Bicarb, Epi 1:10,000, and Lidocaine. - MWHC has added Labetalol to the drug boxes in support of new LifeCare Protocol for transfer of stroke patients with tPA infusing. This is first choice drug for blood pressure management with Vasotec approved for secondary choice during shortages. <p>Ketamine Kits: All Pharmacies reported Ketamine is no longer on shortage and available for stocking in Regional Narcotic Kit. Following discussion, motion was made by Christina Rauch, seconded by Lori Knowles and carried to maintain the 8 Regional Ketamine Kits being utilized by locality EMS Supervisor vehicles through March 2, 2020. Effective immediately, begin stocking Ketamine in used Narcotic Kits as they come in for exchange.</p> <p>Epirite Syringes for EPI: As discussed in last meeting, OEMS has reviewed options for dose limiting syringes and reportedly there are only two on the market right now. One to consider is the Epirite Syringe (\$20 for a box of 100) which could be made as an Epi Kit that is also placed in the current medication box or Regional STAT Kits. SRMC attempted to purchase for review but not in HCA supply and do not hold a Healthcare Account with Amazon. Following discussion the Pharmacies will seek to purchase or obtain a sample from vendor for review at next meeting.</p>	<p>Hospital Pharmacies to begin stocking Ketamine in Regional Narcotic Kits effective immediately. Maintain 8 Regional Ketamine Kits through March 2, 2020.</p> <p>Bring Epirite syringe sample to next meeting for review.</p>

	<p>Culpeper County has ordered the CertaDose products for their 15 ambulances. It was also noted that BoundTree may have a new product to consider.</p> <p>Protocol Recommendations & New Drugs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Versed 5mg/1ml. All Pharmacies reported they would support providing this concentration as available in the Regional Narcotic Kit as requested for proposed seizure protocol and IN/IM administration. Wayne Perry will bring back to Protocol Committee for further discussion on how supplied and if this will be in addition to the two 5mg/5ml vials already provided in Narcotic Kits based on current protocols and needs. Will report back at next meeting. - BP Management with Labetalol & Vasotec. LifeCare protocol approved for transfer of stroke patients with tPA infusing. Medication added to Regional Drug Box for those approved and trained providers. Protocol Committee working on a regional blood pressure management protocol for all providers to have access and use of the new drugs. - Motion made by Lori Knowles, seconded by Bill Tosick and approved with one opposed, to move Glucagon from Regional Med Box to REMS STAT Kit for availability and use by both ALS and BLS providers. Pharmacies should begin stocking in STAT kits effective immediately and pull from med boxes as both come in for restock. REMS to announce to EMS agencies and encourage those not carrying a STAT kit to do so. <p>REMS Medication & Accountability SOG: Medication waste and tracking needs to be added to the SOG for EMS guidance and better accountability. Joey King asked that committee members review current document and will plan to approve changes at April committee meeting for submission to Board of Directors in June, 2020.</p> <p>DEA and Other Legislative Changes Update: Change is coming and still expected within 5 – 10 years. Committee would like to be proactive and look at a cohesive, regional approach to agency medication boxes with medications approved by Agency OMD or RMD to keep standardized once new legislation is approved that will remove medication kits from being provided by hospital pharmacies. Joey King will work with Mike Neace, SRMC to look at how other HCA pharmacies handled moving away from providing EMS agency drug boxes. Will bring back more information at the April meeting.</p>	<p style="color: red;">Approved moving Glucagon from med box to STAT Kit effective immediately. Wayne Perry recommended as we look at Charter that the current EMS Agenda for the Future be given consideration. Also recommended that Committee review progress of 2020 Charter Goals for completion at next meeting.</p> <p>Epi Tanker 30ml Vial Request: Spotsylvania County has asked if the regional pharmacies would consider providing Epi Tanker 30ml vials to locality supervisor vehicles. Since coming off of national shortage, this drug is now \$200 per vial and too expensive for the pharmacies to stock in all regional medication boxes. Anticipate moderate to high volume of cardiac arrests for all localities combined and still too expensive to maintain stock for supervisor vehicles. Much discussion ensued and agreed that while Epi Kits were more difficult to use and multiple boxes may be needed during a code, the drug was being provided as currently available and affordable by the hospital pharmacies. Asked Wayne Perry to contact OEMS to determine if there were any state purchase options for regional medication kits when prices go up significantly. No further action and thanked Spotsylvania Fire & Rescue for their input.</p> <p>Committee Roster: Lori Knowles recommended those members who have not been active on the committee be removed. Joey King will bring the following names to the Council President for removal: Sarah Griffin, Sergio Lareza, John Weedon, and Phil Young.</p> <p>Will need to add two additional EMS provider representatives based on OEMS contract guidelines for committee makeup (5 pre-hospital members required) and Charter. This type of supply is not ordered by pharmacies and may need to look at having REMS order annually for distribution or stock through hospital Materials Management.</p>	<p style="color: red;">Need 2 additional EMS providers appointed to Committee</p> <p style="color: red;">Wayne Perry to purchase sample of EpiRite for review at July 2020 meeting.</p>
New Business	<p>Pharmacy Committee Charter: 2020 – 2022 Charter updates and changes will be discussed at July 2020 meeting. Please send input and updates to Chairman before next meeting.</p> <p>Request for Needle/Syringe in STAT Kit for Glucagon: EMS agencies have questioned if these supplies will be provided in the BLS STAT Kit to prepare Glucagon. Committee discussed and recommended we continue to not stock needles, syringes and devices in med kits as currently doing based on past recalls and issues with having to pull in all kits.
